Camping Rules

We welcome well behaved dogs that must be kept on a lead across the site at all times.

Please ensure all litter is placed in the bins provided, please recycle where possible and compress boxes to save space. The bins around the site are for general waste only but we do have specific bins for cardboard/plastic/tins and glass which we encourage all campers to use. Unwanted camping equipment, electrical appliances and furniture should not be placed in our bins. Please do not leave bags of rubbish on the ground as it attracts wildlife and looks unsightly.

Playing music, is accepted but please keep it to a reasonable level at all times being mindful of all guests. No music is to be played after our noise curfew of 1030pm, after this time only low-level talking is permitted. The use of loud or offensive language will not be tolerated, we are a family site.

Speed limits must be adhered to across site and all property and vehicles are left at the owner's risk.

No refunds are given due to early departure due to bad weather or for any other reason.

Consumption of alcohol and cigarettes on site must remain within current law. Consumption of drugs on site is prohibited and if we are made aware of any person on site not abiding by this they will be reported to the local constabulary.

BBQs and fire pits are permitted but must be raised off the ground (there are bricks available by waste disposal points), disposable BBQs or ground level fires are not permitted.

Nappies, wipes, sanitary products and blue paper should not be placed in the toilets

Anti-social behaviour is not accepted and covers a wide range of unacceptable activity that causes harm to others, to the community or to the environment. With this in mind we ask all visitors to please be respectful of the environment and all other campsite users and campsite staff.

We take a lot of pride in the facilities and services that we offer and regularly review these to benefit our visitors. Please ensure you are respectful at all times and leave facilities in the way that you found them. Report any maintenance or cleaning issues to reception ASAP so that any issues can be rectified quickly and efficiently.

Our campsite is home to many animals and creatures. We would like all visitors to respect this and act accordingly around such wildlife. Our goats can only be fed with goat food purchased from the campsite shop, children need to be supervised at all times around the enclosure and should sanitise their hands after. Any issues should be reported to reception.

Although we are very rural, we do have neighbouring houses around our site therefore please ensure that you are not trespassing at any time. If you are unsure, please ask at reception. Also be aware of children remaining within our site boundaries at all times. Children under 12 years must be supervised at all times.

No muddy hiking boots or wellingtons are to be worn in the amenity buildings. If no other footwear is available then the boots must be cleaned to an acceptable standard before entry or removed and left outside.

Fishing Rules

Fishing is not included in the price of camping and must be paid for in advance at reception.

- No barbed hooks or hooks larger than size 4.
- No braided mainline or mainlines under 5lb.
- Ledger rigs must be free running not fixed.
- No ground bait and all nuts are banned.
- There is a two rod limit.
- Un-hooking mats and towels used to handle fish must be wetted before use.
- No fishing from the islands or from within the lake i.e using waders.
- No bivies or kit to be left unattended - kit may be removed.
- You may only occupy one swim (fishing position) at a time.
- No keep nets to be used, landing nets must be at least 80cm at the widest point
- Do not hold fish (especially Carp) more than 2ft above the ground. Dropping them could easily kill them.
- Children under 17 years old must be accompanied by an adult.
- Fishermen must also comply with the campsite rules listed here

How to Pitch

All pitches are marked with a numbered post; please pay attention to the small arrow it is to this side that you pitch. Your pitch has been allocated based on your requests and requirements at the time of booking.

Electric Pitches are 10amp, please be mindful of the number of items you run off of the electric as an overload could lead to your pitch and/or your neighbours tripping. If this happens, please seek advice from a member of staff.

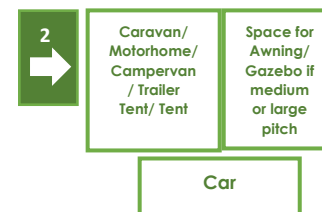
Non-Electric Pitches are in Paddocks 5 and 9 only, if you feel you are booked on a non-electric pitch in error please speak with a member of staff, during busy times we cannot guarantee an electric pitch but we will certainly do our best to accommodate you within our means.

Premium Pitches are 16amp fully serviced pitches, they have a drain to expose of dishwashing water. Again, please be mindful of how many items you are running at any one time to avoid overloading.

Things to be aware of with all pitches:

Chemical (toilet) waste must be disposed of in the chemical disposal room in block 1 and 2

All pitches allow for one car, if you have booked an additional car, please speak to a member of staff for the best place to park it, see the diagram below of how exactly to arrange your pitch, please be respectful of other campers, the diagram below shows a sample
